

THE ROLE OF LEGAL CULTURE IN INCREASING STUDENT CITIZEN LITERACY

A citizen with a high level of civic culture is "an entity that has a deep understanding of the ratio of benefits to society and benefits to society, and in its practice strictly adheres to the principle that this ratio is not disturbed."
